**Judging Criteria**

Only the exteriors of properties will be judged. We’re looking for renovation and restoration projects, large or small, that meet certain conditions, such as:

- Architectural merit and/or historical interest
- Sensitivity to architectural integrity
- Creativity in adaptation for contemporary use
- Soundness of condition
